Kindergarten Graduates

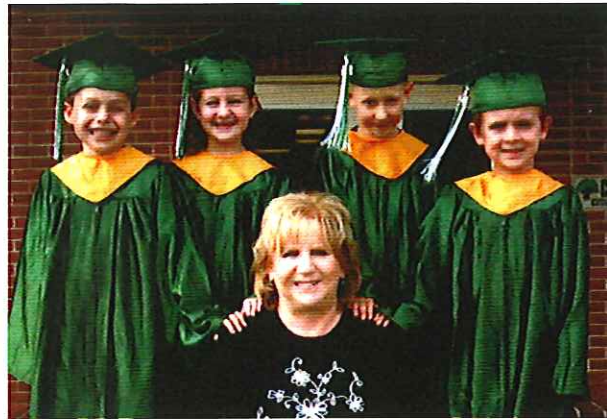
Our Kindergarten teacher, Ms. Ann Petrunak asked what the students wanted to be when they grew up. Here are their responses:
