Chili Cook Off & Gob Bake Off

We've reserved the Family Center for Thursday, November 13 for this annual event. It's from 6:00-7:30.

Here is how it works:

- ☺ Bake your favorite flavor of gob (bring at least 2 dz.) We will cut them into sample sizes and those attending can vote for their favorite by placing money in a jar. The top 2 gobs with the most money at the end of the event will be awarded a fantastic trophy. The gobs not used for the taste testing will be sold. The top winner's gobs will be auctioned off to the highest bidder.
- ☺ Bring a crock pot of your favorite chili. The voting will work the same as with the gobs. Vote by placing money in the corresponding jar. The top 2 with the most "votes" will be awarded a special trophy.
- ☺ There will be an all you can eat chili dinner available for \$5 along with the taste testing of the other chili and gobs.
- ☺ The event will begin at 6:00 with the votes being counted around 7:00 p.m. This will give us enough time to count the votes, award trophies, sell left over chili & gobs & auction off the winner's items.
- ☺ If you'd like to help set up or make the chili (to be sold) during the afternoon of the 13th, call the school.
- ☺ We'd like to know how many gobs & pots of chili that will be entered into the competition no later than Monday morning, November 10. If you don't RSVP, you can still enter. We would just like to have a rough idea of how much table space we will need.

Parent/Teacher Conferences

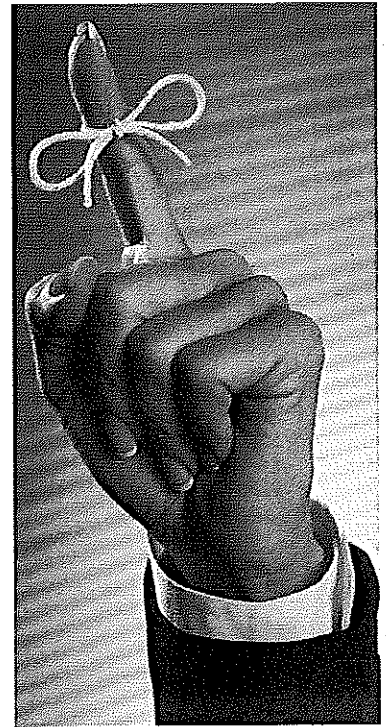
On Monday, November 10 students will be dismissed at 12:30. This will give parents the opportunity to schedule an appointment with their child(ren)s teacher(s).

Please complete this form and return it to the office as soon as possible. The sooner you get to us, the more likely it will be to get the appointment you need.

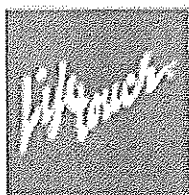


School Pictures are Scheduled

All orders are due back to the school no later than December 5. Delivery will be on December 18.

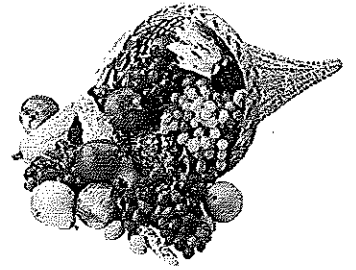
Plan now to buy some pies for Christmas.

Scrip

Why not get a jump start on your Christmas shopping by purchasing your gift cards through the scrip program here at CCCS.

If you aren't familiar with this program, here is all you need to do:

- ◆ Look over the order form and choose the cards you would like to purchase
- ◆ Complete the form and return it to the school along with your payment
- ◆ That's it.

Orders are placed on Monday's around 11:00 a.m. and will be ready for you to pick up or have it sent home with your student on Wednesday's.

Christmas clubs checks should be going out soon, so this would be a great time to get some shopping done in the comfort of your own home.

Another way you can place your order is through the Presto Pay. This is the explanation of how this works. *Give your families a better way to pay for scrip and enable your program for online payment! PrestoPay™ is the electronic payment method which allows a family to securely link a bank account to their ShopWithScrip® account. Families can then choose to have their bank account debited for the entire amount of their ShopWithScrip order when they checkout online. Your organization receives credit for the amount the family paid on your next order, and you don't have to handle any cash or checks.*

Your families will love using PrestoPay! For a small convenience fee of only \$0.15 per order, they can order and pay for scrip on their ShopWithScrip account at any time, day or night. But the real magic of PrestoPay is helping families get their virtual scrip quicker than ever. Families who use PrestoPay will have their Reload orders processed faster, and receive their ScripNow® eCards in a matter of minutes! On top of that, PrestoPay is also completely secure. Each family creates a secret PIN number to use at checkout, so they know their account is protected.
